

Who can use the discount program?

How does the discount program work? Eligible participants can complete an application at www.utahinsulin.net to receive an ID card. Show this card to the pharmacist at your local

pharmacy along with your current prescription, and ask them for the Insulin Savings Program discount rate.



What brands of insulin are available? Covered insulin includes Lantus[®], Toujeo[®], Toujeo Max[®], Novolin[®], Novolog[®], and other Novo brand

mixed insulins. Vials and pens are available. You will pay the after-rebate discount price (NOT the list price) for the insulin you receive.

If you use a different brand of insulin and want to use the savings program, talk to your doctor or pharmacist about switching to the insulin brands listed above. If changing isn't for you, the program will not lower your costs.

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Can I use the savings program with my insurance?

Your insurer may allow payment or reimbursement of the amounts you spend

through the Insulin Savings Program. If your insurer allows electronic payment, ask you pharmacist to process the discounted price as a "Secondary Claim" to your regular insurance. If your insurer does not allow electronic processing, keep your pharmacy receipts and ask your insurer for a direct claim form or reimbursement form. Complete the form using the information on the pharmacy receipts (e.g. date of service, NDC number, quantity, cost, etc.) and submit the form to your insurer for reimbursement.



How much will I pay?
